The Harrow Update

Thank you to everyone who turned up for another very successful meeting in the village hall on 14th February. It was an excellent



turnout, despite the weather and the fact that it was St. Valentine's Day. At the meeting we gave a brief vision of what the pub can be and put forward our plan to raise the remaining funds needed from shareholders.

In addition to their holding, any shareholders prepared to make a loan of £10,000 (or more!) to The Harrow Community Benefit Society (CBS) for a 3 year period, will receive an annual interest rate of 4%. The capital will be repaid after 3 years and will be guaranteed against the value of the property. We are also still looking to attract new shareholders, so if you're considering whether to invest, or know of anyone who might be interested in investing, please let me know and I'll be happy to send details or discuss any queries.

We are close to raising the money we need to save the pub and the terms of the loan are an attractive proposition, so if you would like to earn extra interest on your current savings, please do consider it and we'll be pleased to answer any questions you have.



Stockbury Gardeners

DO NOT be tempted by the warm weather to advance your plants, although we had a lot of sun in late February, please be on your toes. We **WILL** still have frosts and we **WILL** still have 15 degrees in the daytime. The answer is Nike boots!!; Indeed, you will need to run to the greenhouse before the temperature rises too high, it could reach 30C , it may get even hotter , then run to close it up at night and possibly put supplementary heating on before the plants get cold, it sounds difficult but temperature, if used to your advantage, will make all the difference. Good luck.

Later this month, which is quite possibly the busiest seed sowing, month on the calendar, you can sow the following seeds:- AUBERGINES, BROAD BEANS, BEETROOT, CALABRESE, BRUSSELS (yuck!!) [Mmmmm - Ed], CABBAGE, CARROTS, COURGETTES (late under glass), CUCUMBERS (again under glass), LETTUCE, LEEKS, ALL ONIONS, PEPPERS (a bit late now buy from shops as mini plugs) POTATOES in ground and bags, PARSNIPS, PEAS, TOMATOES. Always check the seed packets to see if you are planting them correctly. SO what are you waiting for? Get on with it !!!

The gardeners this month have the first of this year's superstar speakers, Paolo Arrigo from the famous seed company of Italy, he will be presenting "SEED 17" in his inimitable fashion on what is new, and how to sow the latest and the old varieties of seeds, in addition if you have somehow missed the seeds of your choice this year, Paolo will have a range of seeds for you to purchase. The meeting starts at 8 PM on the 2nd March, members are free, visitors and close by societies are £3.00 each.

Top tips this month are on feeding birds and how to deal with MOLES (the soft furry ones). How many of you would own up to owning a pile of old pots and seed trays, hidden behind an old shed or the greenhouse, I know we all do, they do sometimes come in handy!! The problem is that they are a hidey place for slugs and snails. How about this! Try turning them over or putting them in a prominent place for the Blackbirds and thrushes, that way you get rid of the slugs and snails AND feed the birds. Now moles, love them or hate them, once sacrificed for making lead plumbing "wipes" ,now no longer required and hence redundant! Vengeance returned and now destroyer of fine lawns, I can describe how to trap them, indeed I can write a whole page on moles with pictures to accompany, but today, the advice is scoop up their soil heaps and incorporate in your compost mixes that you have purchased; the moles have already sieved and sorted the soil for you so just mix it 50/50 with compost and give it a try.


Are you are following the village pub purchase which is going really well,? Once the purchase is complete, I will be looking for volunteer gardeners to help kick start the garden, so watch this space!

Kentish Seasonal Fayre

Calling all budding cooks, why not try making this traditional Lent dessert

Kentish Pudding Pie

Ingredients

100gm Ground Rice
125gm Sultanas
150ml double cream
2 eggs
250mls milk
75gm caster sugar
Enough shortcrust pastry to line a 20cm flan dish or tin
Quarter teaspoon fresh nutmeg

Method

Pre heat oven 200c/400f/gas mark 6
grease the dish and line with pastry and blind bake for 10 - 15 minutes. Remove from the oven and allow to cool slightly.
Turn down the oven to 190c/375f/gas mark 5
Whisk together the eggs and sugar
Combine the cream and milk in a saucepan and bring to a gentle boil
Whisk in the egg and sugar mixture
Heat until the mixture is thickening and stir in the ground rice and fill the pastry case. Dot the sultanas over the top and grate on a light dusting of nutmeg.
Bake until light and golden (keep checking it every 10 - 20 minutes.

STOCKBURY PARISH SHORT SHORTS

provided by our very own Roving Reporters

- **CRIME** – there was criminal damage to a vehicle in The Street
- **ROAD CLOSURE** – Aerodrome Approach is going to be closed from 14th March for 3 nights from 21:00 to 05:00 for BT works.
- **POTHOLE** – Chalky Lane is in an atrocious state causing some vehicles to not venture that way. Please keep going online to report these even though they've already been reported.
- **LONGTON WOODS** – MBC is aware of “things going on” but there's no information available to us at the moment.
- **BINBURY PARK** – Quinns are still hoping to put their revised planning application in, in April but because Maidstone has passed its quota of new builds, it is unlikely to be considered for some time.
- **STOCKBURY WEBSITE** – there are plans for this to be updated and to be brought in line with compatible formats for modern mobile devices.. A Parish Councillor will be meeting with a parishioner who has expressed an interest in working on this as Mandy Brown has now stepped down after many years of maintaining this site. (Thanks, Mandy, for your years of support – posted by this roving reporter!)
- **MBC** – the decision to cut one position in the Planning Department is now under re-consideration.
- **LITTER ON A249** – due to the cost of traffic management and for a correctly risk assessed exercise, usually the poor state of the A249 is only improved once a year, just before the Kent Show. However, this year there is going to be a “Spring Clean-up” in the last week of March.
- **FLY-TIPPING** – on the subject of litter but this time on a grand scale, this has increased. Please remember to report **ALL** incidents of fly-tipping on the MBC website.
- **STOCKBURY OBSERVER** - the Parish Council acknowledges that the new editor has done a great job with the first edition.
- **HARROW** – there are now 100+ potential shareholders but pledges for the total amount have not yet been received. Grants will make up some of the shortfall and the chairman of the steering committee will also be asking if the Parish Council can give any financial support.
- **STOCKBURY BUS** – this has had a recent software update as some instrument warnings were giving false readings.
- **FOOTPATHS** – Green Lane has now been cut back apart from one small section, thanks to those who have ventured down there through the brambles with their clippers.
- **AOB** – Lorry traffic on slip road from Aerodrome Approach to Bimbury Road is causing concern to residents. Double yellow lines and signage are no longer evident so it is difficult to enforce.
- **HGVs** coming down Bimbury Road are damaging properties and also getting stuck further down Spade Lane. Please try and get a registration number taken from both the front and back of the offending vehicle (the number might be different) and the Company name is also needed. This information to be provided to councillors Cathcart and Woods and they will report this to the respective hauliers.
