

STOCKBURY COMMUNITY BUS

With a great deal of discussion and consideration at the Stockbury Community Bus H.Q, I have to advise you that from 1st March the return fare to Sittingbourne, Maidstone and Hempstead Valley will increase to £5.00. We have fought against this increase for a couple of years now but with the ever increasing cost of fuel, we can no longer sustain the impact that the increase in fuel costs bring us. There will be no change with the National Bus Pass policy, your passes will still be accepted.

The bus hire rate has also increased from 1st March so that a whole days hire is now £60, up from £50 and hire for any portion of that day is now £30.

Do you realise that very few people in the British Isles have the skill or the confidence to offer real assistance if you collapsed or were wounded? If you were faced with a member of your family in need of resuscitation could you attempt to save their lives? Fabrice Muamba had a cardiac arrest on the pitch at White Hart Lane and was 'dead' for 78 minutes. What saved him before reaching hospital was the prompt response of people trained in first aid. Every minute lost before applying CPR is estimated to reduce survival by 10%

I am organising a first aid refresher course in the village hall and I hope to be able to arrange this for a Saturday morning. It will be with St John's Ambulance and their groups usually consist of 8 people.

Things to Do

It seems that this wet weather will never leave us but now is really the time to make sure that the ground in parts has been prepared for the early sowing of seeds. By now you should be thinking of putting in parsnip and carrot seed. I always wait for the ground to warm up a little first, even though it "says on the packet" sow now! In past years I have lost the seeds and had to make a second sowing; after all Stockbury has its own climate, so be patient. Seeds can now be sown in the greenhouse such as indoor cucumbers; I like to grow Telegraph as well as Emile though you may need to assist with a little heat.

A tip to keeping the greenhouse warm is to insulate with bubble wrap (big bubble type) then the big saving is to compartmentalise the section where the seeds are expected to germinate that means you only need to heat a very small area. You must take care to ensure that the sun in March does not cause the heat to rise too much in the daytime. So be careful; it can reach 30 plus degrees C.

Whenever you get an opportunity to wash down the inside glass, use a suitable garden disinfectant. If you use canes and large pots for tomato growing you can also use the same mix to clean them down to reduce the risk of disease.

Roses

At the end of the month it will be time to prune bush roses. I always use this time to weed under the bushes and also pick up debris which could harbour disease. Always burn rose prunings.

Apples

Standard apples should be pruned now, do not prune Espalier or Cordon type until July.

Tomatoes

If you have not sown tomatoes now is the time. If you are ahead of the field, you should pot them on. The sequence for best results is sow the seeds in a seed tray; when the seedlings are 3", sow into a 3" pot and bury the stems nearly up to the 2 leaves. When they are approximately 6" high move to a 10" pot and finally to a grow bag or a large pot.

When you move to the final growing position I always plant several Tagetes (marigolds) into the pot which help keep whitefly away. They can be sown now in the greenhouse.

Cabbage

Early cabbage can be sown indoors early in March to transplant out later.

HELPING OUR HEDGEHOGS 2013

Last year I wrote an article about the decline of our hedgehogs and how you could help by taking part in a national survey.

You may have recently seen or heard in the media that the statistics from the 2012 survey have been analysed and confirm British hedgehogs are in more trouble than the experts thought. The 2012 Hedgehog Hibernation Survey by hedgehogstreet.org proved to be very popular, with around 2,000 people logging around 45,000 hedgehog sightings. This makes it one of the largest datasets about hedgehog activity ever collected. If you registered with them last year you will have already received a reminder to take part in this year's survey. As the closing date for **new** registrations was 1st February it's too late to register for the 2013 survey. However, you can still help even if you're too late to join in with this year's survey.

Slug pellets

It has not yet been proven that slug pellets affect hedgehogs. Metaldehyde is the active ingredient in most commercial slug pellets and research shows that the amount a hedgehog would need to consume to be lethal would be a very large amount either directly from eating slug pellets or poisoned

slugs. However, there have been a few cases of dead hedgehogs being found to have very high levels of metaldehyde in their system. There is also some concern, partly due to research on rats, that although slug pellets may not kill hedgehogs they might affect their reproductive ability, having a negative effect on their population.

- Slugs are attracted to beer so if you make pitfall traps, i.e. a small open container such as a jam jar or plastic cup, half filled with beer the slugs will seek out the beer, fall in and drown. This can however attract and kill other, more beneficial ground dwelling invertebrates.
- Seaweed is a slug deterrent due to its salt content. If you can get it, put plenty of dried seaweed around the base of your plants, being careful for it not to touch the plant stems. The sharp texture will also make it difficult for slugs to move over.
- Use broken egg shells or coffee grounds (often available from coffee shops for free) on the top of your soil around the base of your plant as slugs struggle to cross the sharp, dry surface.
- In the evening, hand-pick the slugs off your plants or cover them in salt (yuk!). If you scatter squeezed halves of oranges or grapefruit around your garden, these will attract the slugs and so collecting them just after dark is much quicker.
- Copper barrier tape around the base or middle of plant pots will prevent slugs from crossing it to reach your plants as it gives them a slight electrical shock on contact. But it's expensive!
- Slugs thrive in damp conditions so change your watering schedule from the evening to the morning, that way the top layer of the soil will be dry when the slugs are most active therefore reducing their efficiency.
- Plant garlic next to your most vulnerable crop as this is a repellent. If you don't have the space, or the inclination, then make a garlic spray (you will need to apply to plants regularly, especially after rain):
 1. Boil 2 bulbs of garlic crushed in 2 pints water for 5 mins.
 2. Strain mixture and add more water to make back up to 2 pints
 3. Let mixture cool before pouring into a bottle
 4. Use 1 tablespoon of garlic mix to 1 gallon of water as needed.
- Wool pellets have been found to discourage slugs and snails. I'm giving these a trial in my own garden this year.
- And, of course, encourage slug eaters such as hedgehogs into your garden!
