

Our meeting in July was good. Ms Zara Evans came along and gave us some ideas about the Flora Art Exhibits for our Summer Show and it also gave the ladies of our club the chance to have a hands on workshop.

Our next meeting will be at the Harrow Public House to play Pétanque so I look forward to seeing you all there at 8pm.

The Stockbury Mini Bus is running an outing to Mount Ephraim on the 11th August which I would have though our members would be very interested in so its first come first served so I would book your tickets fast before you miss out. The cost is £8.50 or £4.50 if you have a bus pass including

Don't forget in August it will be our Summer Show and we are already looking forward to seeing your entries. We want to show the villagers what we can grow, bake and arrange. August is usually one of the hottest months of the year - making watering essential. Try to use grey water wherever possible, especially as water butts may be running low if it has been a dry summer. August is traditionally holiday-time, so you might need to enlist the help of friends and family to look after the garden while you are away.

Top10 gardening jobs this month

- 1. Prune wisteria
- 2. Don't delay summer pruning restricted fruits
- 3. Deadhead flowering plants regularly
- 4. Watering! Particularly containers, and new plants preferably with grey recycled water or stored rainwater
- 5. Collect seed from favourite plants
- 6. Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready
- 7. Continue cutting out old fruited canes on raspberries
- 8. Lift and pot up rooted strawberry runners
- 9. Keep ponds and water features topped up
- 10. Feed the soil with green manures

Country Eye now operating in Stockbury and membership is free!

Country Eye is a scheme led by Kent Police and Kent County Neighbourhood Watch Association and is open to any individual, organisation or business, large or small, in Stockbury.

Sadly, the North Downs has had some heating oil thefts over the last few months. Kent Police believe vigilance and cooperation from locals is very important and a Stockbury branch of the County Eye will be a valued source of information.

It is important to report all suspicious incidents (however apparently insignificant they seem to you) - these can be as simple as cars parked in unusual places at strange times, or petty thefts - perhaps on the face of it not very important, but please give the Police notice of unwanted intrusions. If you have any non-urgent matters related to specific crimes at your premise, please call the Force Control Centre on 101.

PCSO Siobhán de Búrca and Neighbourhood Watch Liaison Officer Suzanne Daniell are currently setting up Country Eye in Stockbury.

Our aim is to promote rural safety, and reduce crime and the fear of crime by inclusion of all elements of the community. All members of the rural community are seen as partners in tackling issues such as rural crime, hare coursing and anti-social behaviour, along with other issues that have such a negative impact on quality of life.

What's involved?

Firstly, please contact PCSO Siobhán de Búrca on 07772 260 99 to receive an application pack. Membership is free and Siobhán is the main contact point from Kent Police in the area, so speaking to her

regarding local issues is a must!

PCSO de Búrca has found that visiting members of Country Eye during her patrols has had positive results regarding criminal activity. Recently, she visited a farmer who explained his concerns for his elderly parents. They nearly got conned by a rogue trader for more then £20,000. Fortunately, PCSO de Búrca spoke to the family and took details of their experience. She gave advice and training to their parents and also presented the case to Trading Standards officers. This stopped the rogue trader in his tracks.

Ms Suzanne Daniell and her team of volunteers are based at Maidstone Police Station, they circulates crime information and intelligence to all participating groups or individuals. As a member, you will receive emails from Kent Police detailing local crimes, which is a great way to know what areas are being targeted by thieves. If you do not have email it is possible to receive recorded phone or text messages. These messages detail when and where a crime took place, and gives the crime number, so that if anyone has further information on a particular crime they can report it. Country Eye also works with Trading Standards and can give up-to-date advice on scams used by criminals.

Country Eye will issue you with a regular newsletter (every 2 weeks) where you can learn of the success stories and campaigns that Kent Police is working on.

It is PCSO de Búrca's intention to hold a meeting in the village hall once we have a suitable number of members.


